Read <u>*Numbers* 21:4-9</u>. How does this correlate with what Jesus says in John 3?

How does our current-day world feel dark, devilish, and dismal? Ponder examples from the news and your own daily events.

Ponder and personally answer these crucial Qs:

Q1: Do I feel dreadfully condemned or dearly loved?

Q2: Am I believing—personally trusting—Jesus' saving work for me and for others? How?

Q3: Am I loving God's light or loving the darkness? How?

Q4: How can you boldly, humbly join God's work of light this week?

We are SO loved! Do you believe God's love story? Really believe it?
