How do you see such "wrong" still alive and well in our day?

How does all that's wrong motivate Paul's life and work?

How should what's wrong stir us and mobilize us for what can be made right through King Jesus?

What difference can the Gospel make, both in our own lives and the lives of others?

Is there anything new—fresh choices and actions—you should take this week related to the Gospel?
